Thesis: Gender and climate adaptation in small island developing States

Content

The thesis aims at analyzing the impact of climate change on gender issues. This thesis is a byproduct of an internship at the UN Women European and Central Asia Regional Office. The thesis focuses on three topics on top of the agenda: climate change, small islands and gender issues. The author presents gender issues in small islands, mainly gender inequalities regarding access to education, labor-force participation, access to Parliament,.... The author then presents the GCCA+ of the European Commission that appears to be far from optimality regarding gender issues.

The thesis is dealing with an important topic. However, the thesis is not always clear regarding the impact of climate change on some gender issues. Gender issues exist whether there is climate change or not or put it differently gender issues are pre-existent to climate change. For instance, access to formal labor market or to credit is more difficult for women, does climate exacerbate this limited access or not? The answer to such question is important for the design of policy response, as, at least, climate change supports must not increase pre-existent gender inequalities.

The thesis does give too little information of the importance of the funding awarded to countries through GCCA+. It would have been interesting to know that a country received X% of its GDP as a GCCA+ funding.
