The finished version of this thesis is surprisingly good, as opposed to the early drafts which I read.

- 1. While the novel is described as "epistolary" but in fact it is more. What other forms of texts are used to narrate the novel? Why do you think Stoker chose to make the narrative so fragmentary?
- 2. You discuss Stoker's life in great detail in the first part of the thesis, but do you see any elements in *Dracula* which have relevance to Stoker's own life?
- 3. The last word in the thesis, "realism", really surprised me. The entire quote is "What, in my opinion, sets *Dracula* apart is Stoker's realistic storytelling which manages to incorporate Gothic tropes such as the supernatural without the loss of any of the realism." What is realism? Where is the realism in *Dracula*?
